

The project

InAction is an Erasmus+ project in the framework of Key Action 2 that was developed to promote Circular Economy practices and a zero-waste lifestyle to youth across Europe, encouraging them to take action towards environmental protection. InAction is a transnational partnership between 3 organizations with a duration of 24 months, beginning in April 2023.

1st Result: InAction Resources

Within the scope of the project's 1st Result, the partners have conducted a survey among 120 youths to determine their level of understanding of the zero-waste concept. In addition, they have compiled a joint report on best practises for a zero-waste lifestyle, which includes best practises implemented, evaluated, and validated within the partner organizations. These documents not only promote a zero-waste lifestyle, but they also set the groundwork for the upcoming tasks.

Kick-off Meeting

The InAction project partners conducted their first transnational meeting to coordinate project activities on July 4, 2023, in Wroclaw, Poland. During the meeting, they were able determine their respective duties and create a distinct work schedule. In addition, they discussed the survey's findings and planned their next steps, accordingly, addressing various management concerns for the successful implementation of the project.
